**Camp director/founder**  
Coach Cotton led the DePauw Soccer program for 39 years, compiling an impressive 390-190-32 record. A leader in the development and expansion of youth soccer in Indiana, he has served as a member of the State Olympic Development Program, and he was recently inducted into the Indiana Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

The core coaching staff will be completed by many other qualified soccer coaches and DePauw varsity players.

## FACILITIES

Students have access to DePauw's outstanding athletic facilities. Students will be given ample time to use the 25-meter by 25-yard swimming pool. Outdoor facilities consist of DePauw's two 75-yard by 120-yard collegiate soccer fields as well as all practice fields.

## TUITION

- Fees for residents are listed with the camp description. Fees for commuters are \$75 less. For enrollment cancellation, all funds paid to date will be returned with the exception of a \$50 cancellation/handling fee.
- All meals are included in the registration fee. (The commuter's fee will include lunch and dinner only.)
- Each student will receive a DePauw soccer training shirt.
- A ball may be purchased for \$30.
- Round trip service from Indianapolis is available for \$50 per person.
- Video analysis and highlight DVD available for \$100 per player (limited service: first-come, first-served basis).

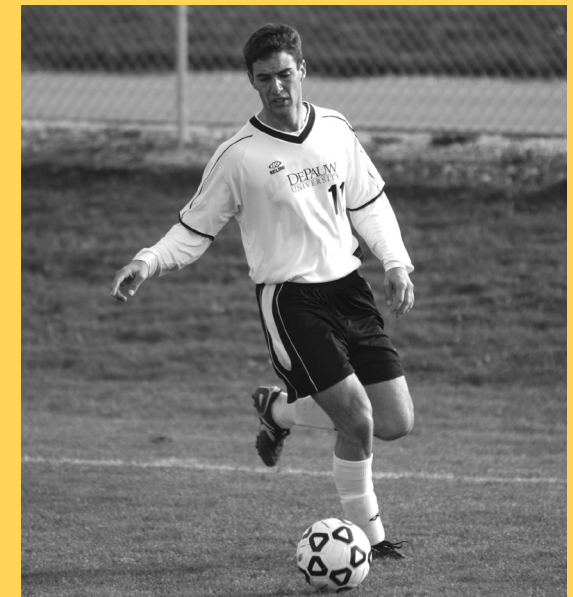
