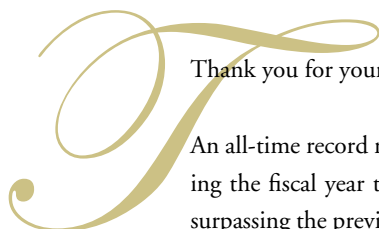

Thank you for your record-setting support in 2004-05!

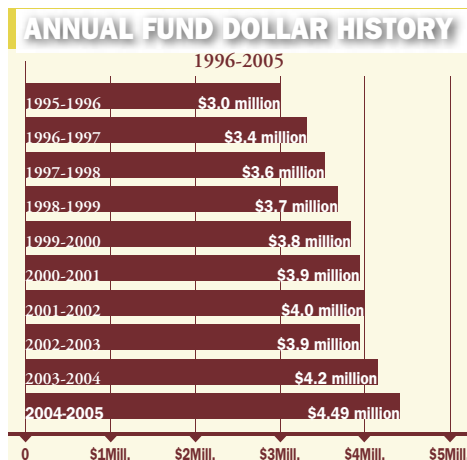
An all-time record number of DePauw alumni participated in the Annual Fund in 2004-05. During the fiscal year that ended June 30, a total of 9,474 alumni made gifts to the Annual Fund, surpassing the previous record of 9,365 set in 1994-95. The University's alumni participation rate is 36 percent, up from 33 percent in the previous year. Annual Fund gifts from alumni and friends totaled \$4.49 million.
