FERID MURAD MEDAL

The Ferid Murad Medal recognizes the senior who has had the most significant scholarly and/or artistic achievements during his or her time at DePauw. The award is named after DePauw graduate and Nobel laureate Dr. Ferid Murad, class of 1958. In 1998, Dr. Murad received the Nobel Prize in Medicine for his discovery of the role of nitric oxide in the cardiovascular system, which led to changes in treatment following a heart attack.

Ferid Murad Medal Recipient Margaret Perry

Maggie Perry, from Shaker Heights, Ohio, is an Art History major at DePauw University. In addition to pursuing her Bachelor of Arts, Maggie is an Honor Scholar with minors in Hispanic Studies and Museum Studies. During her time at DePauw, she was awarded the Art Department Scholarship in 2022, and the Catherine E. Fruhan Art History Student Prize in 2022, and 2023 to support her respective internships at the Art Institute of Chicago and Sarah Gormely Gallery in Columbus, Ohio. During the fall semester of her junior year, Maggie participated in the New York Arts Program with a semester-long curatorial internship at the Brooklyn Museum. As the Arts of Africa Curatorial Intern, Maggie worked on two exhibitions, Sakimatwemtwe: A Century of Reflection on the Arts of Africa, and Africa Fashion, contributing to wall labels, curatorial research, exhibition design, and associated exhibition catalogs. Through her time at the Brooklyn Museum, Maggie worked with colleagues to address the legacies of exclusion in fine art institutions which furthered Maggie's passion for art accessibility. Continuing her work with inclusion and accessibility, Maggie was selected as a 2023 Ryan Learning Center Summer Intern at the Art Institute of Chicago. At the Art Institute, Maggie worked to design and facilitate neurodivergent, traumaconscious, and bilingual tours and studio experiences for over 500 visitors. Following her internship, Maggie's facilitation guides were preserved for use by future interns. Drawing from her experiences at the Brooklyn Museum and Art Institute of Chicago, Maggie was inspired to conduct her Honor Scholar thesis on accessible art engagement practices. Her thesis, titled "Curating Community: Inclusive Art Access," combines the disciplines of Art History, Museum Studies, Education Studies, and Anthropology into research and practical application. Motivated by the power of art to encourage empathy and interpersonal connections, Maggie focused her research on disability justice, barriers to participation, and universal design. She then compiled her findings into a series of inclusively accessible Art Talks that she led during her final semester. Upon completion of her thesis, Maggie's facilitation guides, reflections, and related materials were given to the Peeler Galleries for future Klauser fellows and gallery staff to utilize. Through her thesis work, Maggie utilized artworks from the DePauw University collection, facilitated group discussion, evaluated accessible practices, and created a proposal for inclusive programs at the Peeler Galleries, the University at large, and communities outside of DePauw. Maggie hopes that her proposal will incite positive change for accessibility at DePauw and beyond through an expansion of inclusive practices, applications of universal design, and disability-first design thinking. In addition to her scholarly work, Maggie is a member of Sigma Delta Pi, the National Collegiate Hispanic Honor Society, and the Kappa Pi International Art Honor Society. With a strong passion for leadership and her legacy at DePauw, Maggie has served four years as a tour guide, three years as a First Year Mentor, and her senior year as an Admission Liaison Lead. Maggie contributed as an Art Reviewer for A Midwestern Review, sat on the board of DePauw's annual Art Walk, and served as Chapter President of the Indiana Epsilon chapter of Pi Beta Phi. She was also awarded the Prindle Institute for Ethics' First Year Seminar Writing Prize in 2021 and holds the Women's Swimming & Diving school record in the 50-yard Freestyle. After graduating from DePauw, Maggie plans to continue art accessibility work to prepare for graduate studies in Arts Administration and Disability Studies.

WALKER CUP

The Walker Cup is awarded each year to the graduating senior who has done the most for DePauw University during his or her college career. The prize was established in 1926 by a gift from Guy Morrison Walker, Class of 1890, a successful businessman and presidential advisor. Traditionally, the Walker Cup recipient speaks at commencement.
